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
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Get To Know: Tinodiwanashe Nguruve

With my technical background, I started my career as a Software Engineer, where I gained valuable experience in software development. I then transitioned into a Product Manager role, where I have been fortunate to be a part of numerous successful products at Microsoft. At Microsoft my team works on building products/tools related to engineering systems (like builds/deployments and metrics to track efficiency) so we can improve overall efficiency and output.

Apart from my professional work, I have a keen

interest in content creation, which led me to create various pieces of content, including videos, modeling and working on my current book. Sharing my knowledge and insights on various topics has always been a passion of mine. I'm also very passionate about mentoring because I never really had a mentor and had to figure out everything on my own which attests to how hard I work but having mentors is very important to personal development.

What inspired you to become a social media

influencer:

Well I wouldn't really call myself an influencer yet haha but, being a black, curvy girl with 4c hair, I understand the importance of representation and diversity in the media industry. Growing up, I did not often see people who looked like me in mainstream media, and it made me feel like my appearance was not accepted or appreciated.

When I discovered social media, I realized that it provided a platform where I could showcase my unique beauty and connect with others who share similar experiences. I saw the opportunity to use my voice to uplift and inspire other black, curvy girls with 4c hair, who may also have felt underrepresented in the media.

Additionally, as I began to gain a following on social media, I realized the power of influence and the potential to use my platform for good. I use my social media presence to advocate for body positivity, self-love, and inclusivity, and to amplify the voices of other marginalized communities.

If you could change one thing about social media. What would it be?

As someone who studied Computer Science I'm aware of the fact that social media uses complex algorithms to curate and personalize content for each user. If I could change one thing about social



media, I would prioritize investing in better AI tools to detect and remove harmful content promoting cyberbullying, harassment, misinformation, hate speech, and addiction. The takeaway is it's important for users to be critical of the content they consume and the ways in which they interact with social media platforms. By being aware of the potential negative effects of social media and taking steps to limit their use and exposure to certain types of content. Just remember that online isn't real and not to take comments to heart.

If you could be soneone for a moment who would you rather be and why

While I appreciate the spirit of the question, I honestly wouldn't want to be anyone else for a day. I am content being myself, and I feel grateful for the life that I have. I have unique experiences, relationships, and perspectives that make me who I am, and I wouldn't want to give those up for anyone else's.

However, if I had to choose, I would pick someone who has overcome significant adversity and used their experience to help others. There are many inspiring people who have faced great challenges and come out stronger on the other side, and I would like to learn from their experiences and perspective. But ultimately, I would still choose to be myself because I am proud of who I am and the life I have built for myself.

What is the best piece of advice you could give to a newbie:

Think about your target audience for your page. From there just be yourself, post consistently you will find your tribe and people who genuinely love your content.

What do you do about nasty or negative comments on social media?

Don't take critique from someone you wouldn't take advice from? Negative comments also help push your content so either way you are winning.

awareness and support in the workspace, I believe lives can be saved before it's too late. More conversations about mental health could be initiated in my industry and I hope to see that happening frequently.

She started modeling at the age of 20. Ever since she was a kid she was obsessed with fashion. Her first encounter with the world of modeling was when she came across a channel called Fashion TV around the age of 9. She made the decision to be a model. Unfortunately her dream was delayed due to her commitment with studies

Besides modeling she is a full time digital producer for ZBC

When we asked how she balances her careers she said "It's become quite easy with

time. At first it was challenging, as most bookings can happen during the week and last minute. I normally enjoy working during the morning or day and work night shifts for my job as a producer. Weekends are usually where all the fun happens. My agent makes sure to book me over weekends as I'll have free time and the peace of mind to focus on my modeling. I believe anything is possible if you put your motivation in it and that's what I've done so far as a model."

Through modeling mostly gained the recognition for her craft. She likes to bring her personality and sense of fashion on set. Most photographers and designers give her room to make suggestions and that's what made her unique as a model in Zimbabwe. Also she has gained the knowledge and experience from those she has worked with in the industry and the recognition and respect for what she brings to the table.

come true





"More crowns and more titles are coming on my way. I do not see myself stopping modelling anytime soon,"


This is what she said during the interview. It was a wonderful time to engage with a bubbly and ambitious young girl who is showing that her future is so bright.

The secret to modeling is not being perfect. It's about staying true to yourself and to people around you



as cancer. What determines your victory is how you response to calamity," she says.




MRS SOUTH AFRICA 2023 FINALIST


